Section I E: What are some essential questions that will be used in gaining student

interest?

An essential question is a provocative question designed to engage student interest and guide

inquiry into the important ideas in a field of study. Rather than yielding pat answers, essential

questions are intended to stimulate discussion and rethinking over time. There are two types of

essential questions: overarching and topical. Over-arching questions focus is based on a key

concept, enduring understanding, and/or big idea to prompt inquiry. What provocative

questions will foster is inquiry, understanding, and transfer of learning? An essential question

are interpretive, and have no single "right answer." The following is a list of criteria that can be

generally associated with essential questions;

Provoke and sustain student inquiry, while focusing learning and final performances.

• Address conceptual or philosophical foundations of a discipline/ content area.

• Raise other important questions.

Naturally and appropriately occur.

Stimulate vital, ongoing rethinking of big ideas, assumptions, and prior lessons.
